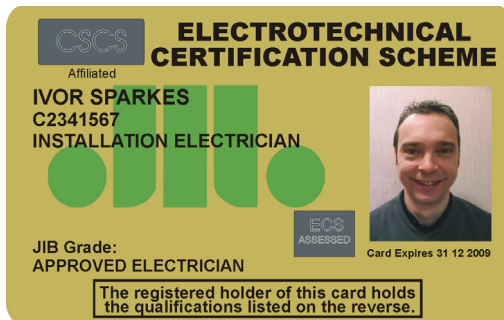


Already up to speed on the 17th and need a certificate to prove it? Take the assessment-only route to qualification in the 17th edition



The T60 assessment is available only to ECS gold or platinum cardholders

Why train in the 17th edition?

BS7671: 2008, 17th edition is the current IEE Wiring Regulations standard in the UK. Fully qualified electricians and managers need to know about the 17th edition to ensure their work is up-to-date and complies with legislation. The formal BS7671: 2008 qualification is awarded through both City & Guilds (C&G) and EAL (EMTA Awards Ltd). Both are equally recognised.

Training in the 17th edition

There are various training courses that prepare candidates for the 17th edition assessment. These range from 1 to 3 days, depending on the holders' current qualifications. For those who hold any of the following C&G qualifications, the 1-day update course is sufficient: 2381, if obtained since June 2001, 2360 Part 2, if obtained since 2004, and 2330 Part 7 or 8. For all others the full 3-day course is compulsory.

The T60 assessment-only option

ECA Education and Training runs a further assessment-only route exclusively for professional, fully qualified electricians or managers, who hold a current ECS gold or platinum card. This is a self-study route for those confident enough to gain their own knowledge of the 2008 wiring regulations, and the ECA provides an open-book paper-based assessment. Successful candidates will gain the formal BS7671: 2008 qualification, awarded by EAL. The cost is £50 + VAT = **£57.50**.
